The QQA 56th Tour of Homes events are rescheduled for the safety of our QQA Community.



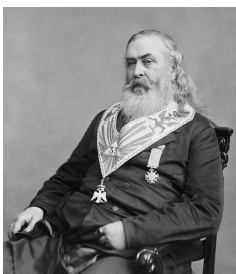
